### **CSCC's 2024 Annual Planning Day Report**

With thanks to Eugen as our host at his rooms in Carlton, the CSCC management committee met on Sunday February 24th for our annual planning day. After morning coffee/tea it was straight to business. As Chair for the day, Gillian opened our deliberations with an Acknowledgment of Country, a welcome to everyone and special thanks to Andy Calder for joining the committee.

Finalising our Vision, Mission and Values statements, to be included in an update of our website, was our first task. The morning session then focused on the theme and the orator for this year's annual Roy Bradley Oration. We then considered how we might collaborate with Dr Professor Anne Pattel-Gray, in an ongoing way, following her impressive and thought-provoking oration last year.

The afternoon session centered on planning for the future with a focus on strategy and activities going forward. A significant realisation from the discussion was how much Covid and the associated restrictions had curtailed our development. Prior to Covid when we had come together on several occasions, the results had been quite inspirational. Should we return to pre-Covid ways of gathering – including for the annual oration, occasional seminars, small discussion groups and other ways of caring for and supporting each other?



# The 2024 Annual Roy Bradley Oration

We are thrilled to confirm that this year's Roy Bradley Oration will be delivered by Pádraig Ó Tuama via Zoom on October 13th. A poet and theologian, Pádraig's work centres around themes of language, power, conflict and religion. He is a compelling poet and skilled speaker, teacher and group worker. From 2014-2019 he was the leader of the Corrymeela Community, Ireland's oldest peace and reconciliation community.

We are currently working on compiling a record of the annual Roy Bradley Oration for distribution and publication. This year's oration with Pádraig Ó Tuama will be the 6th Roy Bradley Oration.


# **Treasurer's Report**

Since our inception more than five years ago now, we have raised over \$31,000. Most of that has come from the \$1,000 commitment of our initial Foundation members. Sales of the book, "The Mystery of God and the Power of Redemptive Relationships" published to honour the life of the late Reverend Roy Bradley, has raised over \$5,000 to date and donations from our "Friends" group and other supporters has raised another \$5,000. Total expenditure has been almost \$12,500, which included the cost of publishing the book, development of our website, including IT expenditure, and costs associated with staging the annual oration.
